

WORK-BASED LEARNING



JOB SHADOWING allows students to observe careers and workplaces in different business and industry sectors to help them determine which career is the best fit for them. At Wallace State, students can participate in our program "A Day in the Life of...".

PRE-APPRENTICESHIPS are designed to prepare individuals to enter and succeed in a registered apprenticeship and ultimately a career. Individuals in a pre-apprenticeship have an opportunity to earn an industry recognized credential and participate in hands-on learning with a career focus. WORK-BASED LEARNING

INTERNSHIPS are paid or unpaid work experiences that generally involves students working in professional settings under the supervision and monitoring of practicing professionals. Familiarizes potential candidates with a specific industry and/or employer.

They provide apprentices with on-the-job-learning (OJL), related technical instruction (RTI), rewards for skills gains, and a nationally recognized credential. WorkKeys assessments measure foundational skills required for success in the workplace and help evaluate the workplace skills that can affect job performance. The assessments measure a range of hard and soft skills relevant to any occupation, at any level, and across industries. WorkKeys assessments validate competencies in the following areas:

- Basic Ability Test (BAT)

- ASE

There are 58 ASE certification tests, covering almost every imaginable aspect of the automotive repair and service industry. In addition to passing an ASE certification test, automotive technicians must have two years of on-the-job training or one year of on-the-job training and a two-year degree in automotive repair to qualify for the certification.
